Creed

Together we respond to the Word read and preached when we say the Creed. The word “creed” comes from credo, Latin for “I believe.” There are three universal creeds from the early Christian church which we use: the Apostles’ Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed.

In services without communion we say the Apostles’ Creed. For the communion service we say the Nicene Creed. In each creed we tell exactly what we believe, and we say it proudly, along with all the other members of our church.

When Christians confess either of these creeds, they assert once again what they have in common. They are baptized into this faith, and they gather in the name of Jesus to be strengthened in this faith.
