## **PROVERBS**

## Lesson 1

- 1. To begin our study of "The Proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel, we need to know more about King Solomon's reign. Read 1 Kings 3.
  - a. What made Solomon so wise?
  - b. What foolish mistakes did he make from the beginning of his reign? Read 1 Kings 3:1-9 and Deuteronomy 12:2-5.
- 2. Solomon was perhaps 20 years old when his father, David, died. Solomon's half-brother Adonijah had competed with Solomon for David's throne.
  - a. Why was it wise for Solomon to ask for a discerning heart?
  - b. What can we learn from his example?
- 3. In secular terms, wisdom is more that head-knowledge. Biblical wisdom also surpasses simple knowledge of data. The account in 1 Kings 3:16-28 provides an insight into Solomon's God-given wisdom. How did it surpass mere knowledge?
- 4. In what other areas did Solomon manifest wisdom?
  - a. 1 Kings 4:1, 21; 5:6; 7:13-14
  - b. 1 Kings 4:29-34; 10:1-9
  - c. 1 Kings 8:27-30, 41-43

- 5. Solomon's reign represents the highest achievements of ancient Israel, achievements God promised through the prophets and King David.
  - a. Read Genesis 22:15-18. What aspect of this promise finds fulfillment in Solomon's reign? (1 Kings 4:20-21)
  - b. In 2 Samuel 7:10-13 God promises blessings for Israel through David's descendent. What aspects of this promise find fulfillment in Solomon's reign? (1 Kings 4:24-25; 5:3-5)
- 6. What grand personal achievements are described in 1 Kings 7:1-12?
- 7. What does the contrast recorded in 1 Kings 6:38-7:1 reveal about Solomon? What does this foreshadow about his reign?
- 8. Psalm 72 was written by Solomon or for Solomon. It summarizes the great achievements of his reign. Jewish and early Christian tradition also viewed this psalm as a description of the reign of the Messiah. Compare the achievements of Solomon in this psalm with the achievements of Jesus. What points of comparison do you see?
